This screening tool is to help you pre-assess if you need to undertake a full analysis of Child Rights Impact Assessment (CRIA).

1. Objective of your project

Do children experience the underlying problem you are trying to solve differently from other population groups? Explain how.

2. Potential impact of the initiative

a) When considering the following identity factors, are any groups of children impacted by this initiative? Explain how.

b) Does the initiative directly impact children? Explain how.

c) Does the initiative indirectly impact children? Explain how.



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d) Does the direct impact uphold children's right to Protection, rights to Participation, and rights to Provision (see the Primer)? Explain how.

e) Do the indirect impacts uphold children's Protection rights, Participation rights, and Provision rights (see the Primer)? Explain how.

f) Does this initiative reduces inequalities¹ between children and adults, or between different groups of children? Explain how.

g) Does this initiative increases inequalities between children and adults, or between different groups of children? Explain how.

If your assessment does not identify any impacts on children or their rights, a full Child Rights Impact Assessment is not required. However, please explain your assessment process and how you reached your conclusion. Otherwise, proceed to do an in depths CRIA using the analytical tool.

¹ Note that achieving substantive equality may require treating different groups of children differently and that treating all children the same may in fact exacerbate inequalities
