The Child and Youth Advocate is an independent officer of the Yukon Legislative Assembly responsible for promoting the views and rights of children and youth eligible to receive Yukon government services

The Manager of Systemic Advocacy provides leadership and operational direction for the delivery of systemic advocacy and a full range of communications and policy functions for the Child and Youth Advocate Office, taking into account the provisions of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child, and Yukon First Nations history, traditions, values, protocols and governance. This position is a key member of the senior management team responsible for the efficient and effective implementation of the *Child and Youth Advocate Act*.

Please ensure your resume clearly demonstrates how you meet the following qualifications:

- A Bachelor's or Master's degree in the field of social policy, social work, psychology, child and youth care, education, law, or other related discipline is desired. Other related education and relevant experience will also be considered.
- Extensive experience engaging children and youth of all ages and abilities, and their families and communities. Experience supporting families and communities in the areas of trauma, violence, addictions, health, education, and intergenerational effects of trauma.
- Recent experience working with First Nations governments, Indigenous organizations, and Yukon government.
- Excellent interpersonal skills including ability to communicate effectively (both orally and written), developing timely, professional and comprehensive correspondence and reports detailing findings and recommendations. Experience providing support and advice and resolving conflicts.
- Demonstrated experience supervising, guiding, and mentoring employees and working as part of a team to develop and manage projects.
- Experience developing communications strategies and a full range of communication products, such as news releases, speaking notes, reports, social media campaigns, curriculum and promotional materials.
