1. Inuvialuit Final Agreement (IFA) 101: http://ifa101.com/

The IFA came into effect in 1984 and was the first comprehensive land claim agreement in the Northwest Territories. We ask that all those interested in learning about the Inuvialuit and the Inuvialuit Regional Corporation start by completing the e-learning IFA 101 course, to get started click on e-learning then sign up to begin. The course is free to everyone.
